Leibniz Universität Hannover (LUH) is a public state university regulated by the University Act of Lower Saxony (Niedersächsisches Hochschulgesetz-NHG). It has the right to confer doctoral degrees and cater for the education and training of the next generation of academics. LUH is member of the TU9 (the alliance of leading universities in STEM fields in Germany) and the German Rectors' Conference (HRK).

Hannover (capital of the Lower Saxony) is the greenest city in Germany, open-minded, multicultural and wide cultural offer. The Faculty of Natural Sciences is spread over the north of the Leine river, surrounded by large green areas, the Botanical Garden, the Royal Barock garden, historical buildings and palaces. Faculty itself counts with both historical buildings and modern, up-to date research centres and labs. The Faculty of Mechanical Engineering is located in a modern campus only 20 minutes by tram from the main campus and combines its





future-oriented infrastructure with new opportunities for cooperation in research and teaching, and knowledge transfer.

3. Services for international/KOSPIE students and special attractions of the area





3.1 What kind of services do you offer to international students and especially for KOSPIE students? (up to 150 words)

There are a wide range of activities and programmes centrally organised by International Office for all international students: pre-arrival information (online), orientation days at the beginning of the term, a wide (inter)cultural activities, as well as workshops to study and live in Germany. The Study Buddy Programme (www.uni-hannover.de/study-buddy) helps international students to get in touch with Hannover students even before arrival. Additionally, there are welcome and information programmes organised by each faculty, and for different specific and degree-related programmes.

KOSPIE students have additionally to this offer a pre-arrival orientation programme, as well as a tutor programme, a place for a student dorm (not in private housing), Spanish speaking counselling if needed, regular follow-up meetings, specific language tandem programmes and trainings, workshops to prepare your internship applications and to accompany during it; as well as visits to research centres, companies, etc.

Besides the Psychological and Therapeutic Counselling (PTB) for the whole university, the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering offers this support for their students too.

Comment: All students are required to pay a semester fee every semester. This fee is made up of the following components:

- •Contribution to the Studentenwerk Hannover (student services organisation): 115.- €
- •Contribution to the Students' Union: 15,80 €
- •Semester ticket: 217,64 €. The "Lower Saxony/Bremen semester ticket" enables you to use ALL modes of regional and local transport in Hannover Metropolitan Area, and to travel second class in Deutsche Bahn's regional trains throughout Lower Saxony, as well as to Bremen and Hamburg central stations at no additional cost.
- •Contribution to the Bicycle Repair Shop: 1,11 €
- •Cultural Ticket: 2.- €
- •Contribution towards administrative costs: 75. €
- •Semester Ticket default fond: 2,20 €

8. Cooperation with companies regarding possibilities for internships

Participants faculties and institutes have contacts with companies and public organisations related to their areas of teaching and research, as well as a bourse and internship office with regular internships calls. There is no formal signed contract regarding internships, but recomendations are possible according to the engagement, interest and performance of students. 9. Further remarks/special services





Following the goal of achieving "Equal opportunities" for all, LUH promotes target-oriented candidates in their programmes, including students from so-called less favoured households, and people with refugee background/history. We further also female students under the concept of gender equality, especially in STEM areas.

Further Services and Units:

Students at LUH profit from the Leibniz Information Centre for Science and Technology and University Library (TIB), which, as the German National Library of Science and Technology, is especially acknowledged worldwide for its expertise in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Leibniz Language Centre (LLC)

The Centre offers around 220 language courses and special courses for approximately 5,000 students each semester, as well as during semester breaks.

ZQS/Schlüsselkompetenzen (Centre for Quality Enhancement in Teaching and Learning) ZQS/Schlüsselkompetenzen is the central point of contact regarding key competences and services that promote ability and aptitude for study as well as employability. They support exchange with the labour market.

LUH's centre for university sports (www.hochschulsport-hannover.de) organises an extensive sports programme including more than 100 different sport disciplines, most of them free of charge or in great part subsidised.

10. Housing situation

There are 20 halls of residence managed by Studentenwerk Hannover that offer good value accommodation – some of which are located near the university buildings. KOSPIE Students enrolled at LUH are eligible to live in one of the halls of residence managed by Studentenwerk. Almost all rooms are furnished and have high-speed internet access at moderate prices.
