The Ernst Abbe University of Applied Sciences is a single campus university, which is located south to the city centre of Jena. Jena is a major science hub in Central Germany, with two Universities and 12 research institutes (e.g. Max Planck, Leibniz and Fraunhofer research societies). With a total population of 110,000 inhabitants – including 20,000 students, 4,500 scientists and 35 percent of the employees holding an academic degree – Jena is a young and vibrant city that offers excellent conditions for studying as well as enjoying a high quality of living.

There are numerous hiking paths starting in Jena and running up to the elevated plains from which you will have a panoramic view of the town and its surroundings. Those who like hiking, running, mountain biking and other sports will find a paradise here.



Weimar

Weimar is located about 20 km away from Jena and can be easily reached train, in about 20 min. Without exaggeration, it can be claimed that Weimar is one of the most important towns in Germany. Weimar is known for a number of well-known people, i.e. Cranach, Goethe, Schiller, Herder and Liszt. It is rich of history and the birthplace of the world-famous Bauhaus.

The semester fee is a compulsory charge coming due prior each semester. It covers basic services available exclusively to students. The semester fee includes the student's identity card, the culture ticket with which one can get free entry to cultural events as well as the Germany wide transportation ticket ("Deutschlandticket") with which one can use all local and regional public transportation services in Germany free of charges.

The Ernst Abbe University of Applied Sciences Jena is located in an attractive research and industrial region in Central Germany and is very well connected within this region. The density and availability of opportunities for students and graduates in science, business and society is a unique selling point for Jena. Students at the EAH Jena take advantage of these opportunities to complete practical phases in companies (research internship), to carry out practical work during their studies (working student), to write theses in companies and to find employment after successfully completing their studies.

10. Housing situation

In Jena, there are a total of 3,500 places available in 27 halls of residence run by the Studierendenwerk Thuringia. Accommodation in the halls of residence is coordinated with the Studierendenwerk for KOSPIE students. KOSPIE students are supported with the room application by the International Office. In addition, the International Office sends a priority list to the Studierendenwerk. KOSPIE students are also included in the priority list. A regular data transfer takes place between the Housing Department (Studierendenwerk Thüringen) and the International Office (EAH Jena) to ensure that the applications of the prioritised students have been received and confirmed.
