Together with its twin city, Neu-Ulm, located just across the Danube River, Ulm forms a distinctive urban area. Situated in southern Germany's Baden-Württemberg, near Stuttgart, Munich, and the Alps, it provides an ideal environment for living, studying, and working. Ulm combines medieval and modern architecture, complemented by a rich array of cultural, sports, and leisure activities. Its dynamic economy, fueled by medium-sized businesses, global players, and high-tech industries, makes Ulm one of Germany's most economically vibrant regions.

As KOSPIE students at Ulm University, you will benefit from a customized welcome and support program designed to ensure your success. This program includes a thorough orientation at the start of your stay, as well as cultural activities such as city and campus tours, and company visits. You will also receive intercultural training, along with academic and administrative advising to ease your transition to life in Germany.

To help you secure an internship, we offer intensive application training and targeted mentoring from experienced professionals. Additionally, student tutors will assist you with administrative tasks and provide peer-to-peer mentoring, complemented by professional guidance from the International Office, Career Service staff, and faculty.

3.2 What are the most special attractions for international students in the region? (up to 250 words)

Ulm provides international students with a rich array of experiences. It is an ideal base for exploring both local and European attractions while enjoying a vibrant and culturally rich student life:

Ulm Minster: Home to the world's tallest church steeple, standing at 161.53 meters (see picture on the right).

Ulm Christmas Market: One of Germany's oldest and largest Christmas Markets; it offers a festive, romantic atmosphere with traditional stalls and seasonal charm.

Oath Week: A historic city festival dating back to medieval times, featuring concerts, fairs, and "Nabada," a







unique water parade with themed and self-made boats accompanied by live music on and off the Danube River (see picture on the right).

Arts, Culture & Sports: Ulm boasts a rich cultural scene with art museums showcasing works from prehistoric to contemporary art, numerous theaters, clubs, concert halls, and choirs. For sports enthusiasts, the city offers both outdoor and indoor climbing gyms, a variety of sports clubs, and is home to Ratiopharm Ulm, one of Germany's top basketball teams.

Prime Location: Located in the heart of Europe, Ulm offers convenient access to Stuttgart, Munich, the Alps, Lake Constance, the Black Forest, and the renowned Neuschwanstein Castle, all within a two-hour train ride. Additionally, Ulm benefits from direct high-speed train connections to major European cities such as Berlin, Paris, and Vienna.
